

PDF Instructions for Authors

4th IEEE International Future Energy Electronics Conference (IFEEC 2019)

Final manuscript (revisions as requested by Publication Chair) submission deadline is 15 SEPTEMBER 2019.

Please note that papers presented at IFEEC 2019 must be original material and not have been presented at previous conferences or previously published. Manuscripts not received by the deadline above may not be published in the Proceedings and will not be presented at the conference.

Due to IEEE technical co-sponsorship of IFEEC 2019, your final paper is planned to be included in IEEE Xplore for archival value after the conference. However, IEEE reserves the right to exclude an acceptance paper from inclusion in IEEE Xplore if it is not presented at the conference.

Please do not add any page numbering, header or footer (other than the copyright info discussed below, if applicable).

Before Creating a PDF

Please add the copyright notice to the **bottom left side of the first page of your source document** before creating your PDF.

Copyright notice:

- For papers in which all authors are employed by the US government, the copyright notice is: **U.S. Government work not protected by U.S. copyright**
- For papers in which all authors are employed by a Crown government (UK, Canada, and Australia), the copyright notice is: **978-1-7281-3153-5/19/\$31.00 ©2019 Crown**
- For papers in which all authors are employed by the European Union, the copyright notice is: **978-1-7281-3153-5/19/\$31.00 ©2019 European Union**
- For all other papers the copyright notice is: **978-1-7281-3153-5/19/\$31.00 ©2019 IEEE**

Latex users can add following lines just before `begin{document}` for the copyright notice to show up (shown below as an example for the fourth case above):

MS Word users can use: 'Insert' -> 'Text box', insert the appropriate copyright notice in the textbox, and place the box (without border) at the bottom on the first page.

Proofread your source document thoroughly to confirm that it will require no revision.

You will need to use the **IEEE PDF eXpress website** to validate your papers, to make sure that it is Xplore-compliant.


IMPORTANT: Any changes made to a PDF after IEEE PDF eXpress conversion or PDF Checking may invalidate Xplore compatibility. This includes headers, copyright notice, watermarks, etc. If any of these elements are desired, they should be added to the document before a PDF is created.

Creating your PDF eXpress Account

Log in to the IEEE PDF eXpress website: <http://www.pdf-express.org>

First-time users should do the following:

1. Select the New Users - Click Here link
2. Enter the following:
 - **47410X** for the Conference ID
 - your email address
 - a password (choose a password for your account. Valid characters for password creation include: A-Z a-z 0-9 - _)
